



Our **Erythronium** are supplied as **freshly lifted, flowering-sized bulbs** ready for planting.

Erythronium (fawn-lily, trout-lily, dog's-tooth violet, adder's-tongue) is a genus of 20-30 species of spring-flowering perennial plants with long, tooth-like bulbs, elegant pendant flowers and attractive leaf markings. They are native to forest and meadow in temperate regions of the Northern Hemisphere.

The species and cultivars we offer are all selected because they are good garden plants. They grow well in dappled shade for example in a shrub border. They must remain moist at all times and are generally easy to establish if planted in the appropriate location in free draining soil.

They flower from late March through April. Their leaves die back in June and the bulbs become dormant over the summer. This is the best time to buy and plant **Erythronium** bulbs. They root down in the autumn and then the attractive glossy leaves start to emerge towards the end of February.

Our collection of **Erythronium** has taken many years to develop. It takes at least 5 years to grow a flowering sized bulb from seed and propagation by division of the bulbs takes time.

Despatch and delivery

The despatch period for **Erythronium** bulbs is during the second half of July, August and early September. We send them to you carefully wrapped in moist coir so that you receive them in the best condition. A planting advice sheet is enclosed with every order.
