Picture No.	Name	Description
1	<i>T. grandiflorum</i>	A lovely plant from the woodlands of the Eastern United States. From its underground rootstock it sends up spring shoots topped with glistening white three petalled flowers. It comes up year after year like our bluebells, to give a very special touch to the spring garden. Height: to 30cm. Seed grown.
2	<i>T. flexipes x sulcatum</i> 'Harvington Dusky Pink'	An exciting vigorous range of hybrids with striking dusky pink flowers. One of our own hybrids nearly 15 years in the making! Seed grown or by division. 40-50cm.
3	<i>T. flexipes</i> 'Harvington Selection'	Vigorous form with white flowers and light pink eye. Tolerant of limey soils. Height: 45cm. Rhizomes by division. One of our best Trilliums for establishment and growth.
4	<i>T. erectum album</i> 'Harvington Clone'	Clear white flowers with black eyes. Forms strong clumps. Height 20-40cm. Rhizomes propagated by division.
5	<i>T. erectum</i> 'Harvington Dark Form'	Maroon red flowers on robust plants up to 35cm high.
6	<i>T. flexipes</i> 'Harvington Hybrids' (from <i>flexipes x simile</i>)	Very vigorous 40-50cm high. Large leaves, dark centred white flowers. Seed grown.
7	<i>T. kurabayashii</i>	Large, dark purple-red flowers growing from distinctive mottled leaves. <i>T. kurabayashii</i> is an early flowering Californian species. Flowers from late March through April. Grown from seed. Our strain originated at the Royal Horticultural Society's garden at Rosemoor, Devon.
8	<i>T. albidum</i>	A fragrant rose-scented Trillium. Early showy upright white flowers. Flowering mid-March onwards. From California. Seed grown.
9	<i>T. simile</i>	Large white flowers with black eye. Vigorous grower. Grown from seed.
10	<i>T. grandiflorum</i> 'Flore Pleno'	A lovely double white flowering form of <i>T. grandiflorum</i> . Often takes a year or two to really establish, but where happy it makes large clumps.
11	<i>T. grandiflorum f. roseum</i>	A beautiful and much sought after pink selection of <i>T. grandiflorum</i> . The parent plants were collected in Virginia many years ago and all our current stock is grown from selected hand pollinated plants.
12	<i>T. chloropetalum</i>	This holds its maroon red flowers through April and May. The species form California with beautifully mottled leaves forms strong clumps given time and is very persistent. In our experience 25 years in one position is not uncommon. Height up to 35 cm
13	<i>T. sulcatum</i>	Described by experts Frederick and Roberta Case as, 'A robust and splendid plant'. 'sulcatum' means "boat-shaped" and refers to the upturned margins of the sepals and petals. Dark maroon red flowers on bold plants up to 40cm high. Rhizomes propagated by division and seed.
14	<i>T. luteum</i>	Beautiful mottled leaves surround the delightful yellow flowers that deepen with age. A triplet lily from the Eastern United States Flowers May/June, later than most Trillium. Height 15-30cm
15	<i>T. vaseyi</i>	Later flowering Trillium. Holds maroon-red nodding flowers below leaves. From mid-May onwards. One of the very choicest of this glorious plant family.
